- Playoff Draws:** All teams competing in pool play advanced to the single-elimination playoffs regardless of place of finish in their respective pool.

A playoff draw was held for each division to determine the game match-ups for bracket play. Each draw was held separately immediately following the conclusion of pool play games for that division. Each team representative was provided a chair and sat facing the posted bracket at the tournament results area. In Round 1, teams that finished fourth in their pool (Women's and Co-Rec only) were allowed to draw numbers first to select their place in the bracket. The order in which representatives drew numbers in each round was determined by randomly drawing each team's name from a bag and was not based on record. In each round, teams were permitted to only select from select designated places on the bracket based on the round (last place pool teams drawing had to choose from the highest numbered places on the bracket, and so on). In Round 2, teams that finished third in their pool drew numbers for the same process. In Round 3, teams that finished second in their pool (pool runners-up) drew numbers for the same process. Finally, teams that finished first in their pool (pool champions) completed the same process. Each draw took about 10-15 minutes.
