



ໜ NIRSA and The University Network Expand Programs

With the successful completion of the 2003 pilot of the NIRSA and The University Network program, this exciting initiative has turned out to be a very popular choice with NIRSA Institutional Members nationwide. Installations continue monthly and The University Network, a NIRSA Associate Member, is well on its way to expand from the nine pilot schools to an anticipated 50+ schools by the end of first quarter of 2004.

Participating NIRSA Member Institutions receive a flat screen electronic display, at no charge, to be installed in their campus recreation center near the controlled entry area. A web-based feed provides national corporate advertising, yet a school has 100 percent editorial control over what appears on its screen.

Member Institutions can use the screen to communicate messages for recreational sports or the university administrators through sight, sound, and motion. Campus messages are supplemented with paid advertisements. There is significant revenue sharing between participating

Institutions and The University Network from net-paid advertising sales. Campuses receive a finder's fee if they introduce The University Network to any new advertisers who purchase paid ads. There is a separate revenue-sharing agreement between the Association and The University Network based on overall net advertising sales.

Originally, candidates for participation in the NIRSA/The University Network program were suggested by the directors of participating NIRSA pilot schools and The University Network officials. However, requests for information and installations have increased significantly as more and more NIRSA members learned about the success, advantage, and benefits of The Network. To meet this growing demand, The Network has stepped up capabilities and is prepared to increase the program to include even more NIRSA Member Institutions.



A panel of business and fitness experts judged the nominees on five criteria: employer investment, such as workout facilities and

incentives; quality of life factors, i.e. contributions or incentives to the local community to promote healthier choices; labor-management relations, such as safety issues, and self-improvement; leadership, i.e. innovative programs to promote wellness; and recognition for contributions to worksite and community wellness.





- Provide a means of identifying individuals who possess the necessary knowledge and expertise required in the field.
- 3. Promote the educational standards set forth for recreational sports professionals.
- 4. Encourage professional growth and development of recreational sports personnel.

The multiple-choice exam covers programming, management/operations, risk management/legal concepts, program evaluation, participant's rights, history/philosophical foundations, and professional ethics. Potential CRSS exams dates occur throughout the year and are marked with an asterisk on the <u>Calendar of Events on the NIRSA Network website</u>.

Most campuses have career centers to assist students and alumnae craft résumés and cover letters. Some hold mock interviews, review jobsearch etiquette, and offer input on appropriate attire. NIRSA Professional Members are also an excellent source of input since many of them have first-hand experience in the COC. Job seekers should bring a supply of résumés, thank you cards, and other materials to the COC ready to apply for the many positions that will be available.

Employers should post their positions on BluefishJobs.com at least a week before the COC opens (on Saturday, April 17, 2004), however, note that the most motivated job seekers



will be perusing the job listings before they get to Albuquerque! Early posting will ensure inclusion on the printed handouts distributed to job seekers in the Center. For an additional fee, group presentation rooms with complimentary audio/visual equipment can be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis, well in advance. (FYI: Inquiries regarding availability for 2004 have already been received.)

Because of his service to the association, he received the Region II Service Award. This is an honor that he humbly accepted and values a great deal because it came from the members of the NIRSA.




Certified Recreational Sports Specialist (CRSS) exam applications are available through the NNC Education Department. Individuals must submit a complete exam application accompanied by the appropriate documentation and fee to the NNC, a minimum of 30 days prior to the preferred testing date. Applications will be reviewed and applicants will be notified of their eligibility to take the examination. The NNC will handle requests for special auxiliary aids during testing, if a written description of the need is attached to a complete application. Both the application and request must be received at the NNC 30 days before the proposed testing date.


